

Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowships Call for Applications

2017-2018 Academic Year Fellowships Application Submission Deadline: February 10, 2017

The Kimberly Green Latin American and Caribbean Center (LACC) at Florida International University is privileged to announce a call for applications for the Foreign Language and Area Studies (FLAS) Fellowship.

The FLAS fellowship supports language training in Less-Commonly-Taught Languages (LCTLs), including Portuguese and Haitian Creole. The fellowship assists in the advancement of knowledge, resources, and trained personnel for foreign language and area/international studies and supports the development of a qualified pool of international experts with global competence designed to meet U.S. national needs.

The Academic Year FLAS fellowship covers tuition and fees (up to 12 credits for graduate students; up to 18 credits for undergraduate students) for Fall and Spring semesters. Additionally, fellowship recipients are awarded a stipend (approximately \$15,000 for graduate students; \$5,000 for undergraduate students).

Full-time, degree-seeking FIU graduate and undergraduate students in any discipline who are focusing their study on Latin America may apply. FLAS Fellowship recipients are required to complete at least **one Latin American and Caribbean-related area studies course and one Portuguese or Haitian Creole course** each semester at FIU while holding the fellowship.

Undergraduate student recipients must be prepared to study one of the approved languages at the intermediate or advanced level. Proof of proficiency will be required for students applying for the FLAS Fellowship. Graduate students may study one of the approved languages (Portuguese or Haitian Creole) at the beginning, intermediate, or advanced levels. Students at the beginning level are welcome to apply, but preference will be given to graduate students at the intermediate or advanced level. Students in the professional schools (Business, Law, Medicine, Journalism, Social Work, Engineering, etc.) and those planning a career in U.S. government service are strongly encouraged to apply.
