##### FIU Leads Creation of Doctoral Advisor Program

FIU is one of six universities in the U.S. that is developing a new program to support doctoral advisors. Created by Epigeum, this transformational online training program will meet the growing need to support Ph.D. supervisors. Known as "Advising Doctoral Students," the program will contain eight, 30-minute interactive online courses, with an additional 20 hours of optional personalized portfolio learning. FIU will collaborate with the University of Michigan, Kansas State University, University of California (San Diego), and other partners in developing a U.S. edition of the international program. The final version of the online training is expected to be released in 2015. Modules will include:

The Doctoral Context and the Contemporary PhD;  
Attracting the Best PhD Candidates;  
Setting your Candidate on the Right Course;  
Managing Progress; and  
Expectations and Examinations.

These modules will empower FIU to deliver a world-class online training program in the supervision of doctoral students. I will be back with more information toward the end of Spring 2015.

Please join the UGS in congratulating Presidential Fellow and History doctoral student Micah Oelze, who has been awarded a Fulbright Hays grant to conduct dissertation research in Brazil, one of only 83 grants awarded nationwide, and the only one to be awarded in the state of Florida this year.

Administered by the U.S. Department of Education, the Fulbright Hays grant program seeks to deepen knowledge of areas in the world not generally included in U.S. curricula. These programs are part of the larger Fulbright-Hays Program, which dates to 1961 when the late U.S. Sen. J. William Fulbright sponsored legislation for several programs that would aim to increase mutual understanding between the United States and the rest of the world.
