During this restructuring phase of graduate school activities, UGS will continue to post this newsletter with important deadlines and news for faculty. I will also use this opportunity to share with you a summary of important discussions and surveys done by consortia of US universities and the Pew Charitable Trusts. In general, a distillation of the major areas of concern on doctoral programs can be simplified into three sets of continua, shown below. In the coming newsletters, I will share with you survey results on each of these three dimensions. I found them to be very valuable in identifying our challenges ahead. I'm sure you too will find them valuable.



Graduate Faculty and DAS Applications Now Available

Complete DAS and graduate faculty applications—including the departmental and college level recommendations—are due at UGS by **October 15th, 2015**. We strongly recommend that all applications be submitted to your respective college/school dean in a timely manner, allotting for enough time (at least two weeks) for the application to be reviewed and assessed by your dean before it is submitted to UGS by the October 15th deadline. Applications received after October 15th will be automatically moved to the spring evaluation cycle.
