



Message from the Dean

During my review of the Annual Program Summaries for 2012-'13, it is clear that our doctoral programs continue to rely on Graduate Teaching Assistant (GTA) allocations to grow their doctoral enrollments. Even in the case of programs where extramural funding is steadily increasing during the past three years, the proportion of doctoral RAs to TAs/GAs is decreasing. This trend is not consistent with what we find at our peer institutions. We should do more to increase the numbers of RAs on research grants while at the same time establishing program-wide practices that would leverage RA funding with TA/GA stipends. Any plans to increase doctoral enrollments should include this strategy.

In the case of programs that generally do not attract significant funding from external sources, there are vast differences in the manner in which Educational and General (E&G) funds are used. The E&G funds used by these programs to graduate a single doctoral student ranged from \$34,000 to \$187,000. This variation is because of several reasons, namely, length of time a student is allowed on a GTA, self-funded students attracted to the program, and other factors.

I urge the programs to engage themselves in a discussion of these factors during their review of Annual Program Summaries. UGS is in the process of analyzing these and other numbers and trends to engage our colleges in strategic enrollment growth plans.

UGS Assistant Dean Receives Prestigious Award

Dr. Sonja Montas-Hunter, Assistant Dean, received the Florida Education Fund President's Award for supporting the McKnight Doctoral Fellowship. In the last three years, UGS has more than doubled the number of these fellows on campus, from twelve fellows in 2012 to thirty that we currently support through the FEF McKnight Doctoral Fellowships.

Established in 1984, the FEF's McKnight Doctoral Fellowship Program has increased the number of African Americans who have earned Ph.D.'s in historically underrepresented, crucial disciplines where African Americans have not historically enrolled and completed degree programs. The FEF has awarded more than 750 Fellowships to African Americans and Hispanics pursuing Ph.D.'s, and the Program enjoys an impressive, nearly 80% retention rate. More than 300 Fellows have graduated with Ph.D.'s in an average completion time of 5.5 years.

Dissertation Writing Retreat

In coordination with the FIU Center for Excellence in Writing, UGS will once again host the Dissertation Writing Retreat. The dissertation writing retreat is designed to help participants make substantial progress towards completing their dissertation. The goal is to help writers who are stalled, isolated, off-track, or working towards project completion. Participants will:

- Have the opportunity to meet with a representative from FIU Statistical Consulting
- Create an individual work plan and establish daily writing goals
- Meet with a Writing Retreat representatives to discuss progress
