GSAW Symposium

Wednesday, April 2, Noon in the MARC Pavilion

We are excited to welcome our keynote speaker, Adam Ruben, PhD, who will kick off this year's GSAW Symposium . Author of Surviving Your Stupid, Stupid Decision to Go to Grad School (Random House, 2010), a satirical guide to the low points and, well, lower points of post-baccalaureate education, Adam Ruben is a writer, comedian, storyteller, and molecular biologist. Adam earned a Bachelor of Arts in Molecular Biology with minors in Engineering Biology, Creative Writing, and Theater & Dance at Princeton University (2001), and a Ph.D. in Biology at Johns Hopkins University (2008). For ten years, Adam has taught an undergraduate stand-up comedy class, one of the most popular January "Intersession" courses at Johns Hopkins University. He currently teaches storytelling with SpeakeasyDC, writes the humor column "Experimental Error" in the otherwise respectable journal Science, and has been seen and heard on the Food Network's <u>Food Detectives</u>, the Science Channel's <u>Head Rush</u>, and NPR's All Things Considered. In addition to his day job developing a malaria vaccine at Sanaria Inc., Adam travels the country, performing his show as part of anti-bullying programs and talking about his book to audiences of disaffected grad students.

Adam's talk will be followed by an **Industry Panel**, beginning at 1:00 pm in the MARC Pavilion. The industry panel, which will include professionals in business, the non-profit sector, the sciences, and academia, will provide students with the opportunity to learn about how graduate education impacted the lives of the panelists and what today's graduate students need to know about the job market and their careers. At 2:30 pm, students will be joined by a panel of research and funding experts for a **Funding and Fellowships Panel** discussion. Panelists will share lessons, advice, and strategies for securing graduate fellowships and funding opportunities. The day will wrap up with a **yoga session** at 4:00 pm.
