[AAAS Mass Media Science & Engineering Fellowship](#) - For 10 weeks during the summer, the AAAS Mass Media Science & Engineering Fellows collaborate with media professionals at radio and television stations, newspapers, and magazines. As part of their job, the scientists and their journalist-hosts strive to make science news easy for the public to understand. The program strives to improve public understanding of science by enhancing coverage of science-related issues in the media. By embedding science students and recent grads in media outlets, the Fellows learn how to communicate scientific topics in clear and engaging ways, better understand how science is covered in the media, and build up a professional network of scientists and journalists who can work together to share science effectively. In its almost 50-year history, the program has supported nearly 900 fellows.

**Award (max amount):** up to \$10,000

**Application deadline:** January 1, 2026 at 11:59PM (EST)

[Duke Visiting Scholar Program](#) - Visiting Scholars may come to the Center for either a semester, a full academic year (which runs from the end of August to the beginning of May), or a twelve-month period. (Those who wish to come for shorter stays may wish to consult the "Academic Visits" section.) Though the principal purpose of the program is to allow successful applicants to pursue their own research, Visiting Scholars are invited to join a vibrant intellectual community by participating in the many other programs (e.g., workshops, HOPE lunches, and conferences) that the Center offers. More junior scholars may also wish to sit in on classes during term and to participate in the "Summer in the Archives" program.

**Award (max amount):** Stipend Varies

[GWIS National Fellowship](#) - The Graduate Women In Science (GWIS) National Fellowship Program promotes knowledge in the natural and social sciences and encourages women's academic and professional careers in the sciences. Endowment funds, mostly generated from bequests, provide the annual income that supports scientific research conducted by GWIS fellowship winners.

**Award (max amount):** \$10,000

**Application deadline:** January 12 2026, 5:00PM (EST).

[Dr. and Mrs. W.C. Culp Student Research Grant](#)- Grants are available to undergraduates and medical students currently enrolled in a MD, DO, or PhD equivalent degree program in medical institutions within the United States and Canada. This funding mechanism is intended to provide salary support for students conducting summer research projects that test a new idea or help support a new area or direction of research in interventional radiology. Applicants must be citizens of the United States or

Canada or have permanent resident status therein. DACA recipients are also eligible. Permanent Residents and DACA recipients must submit documentation of their status.

**Award (max amount):** \$6,000

[Master of Fine Art Fellowship in Painting & Sculpture](#) - The Dedalus Foundation Master of Fine Arts Fellowships in Painting and Sculpture are awarded annually to final-year students who are graduating from an M.F.A. degree program in the United States. Candidacy for the fellowship is **by nomination only**. Each fall, department chairpersons from M.F.A. programs in painting and sculpture are invited to submit nominations. Nominees should be graduating in the spring semester that directly follows the fall nominating cycle. Nominees need not be U.S. citizens. Each institution may nominate two candidates.

**Award (max amount):** \$15,000 stipend each year

[Department of Energy Computational Science Graduate Fellowship \(CSGF\)](#)- The program fosters a community of energetic and committed Ph.D. students, alumni, DOE laboratory staff and other scientists who want to have an impact on the nation while advancing their research. Fellows come from diverse scientific and engineering disciplines but share a common interest in using computing in their research. Must be U.S. Citizen or permanent resident at the time of application, eligibility will be extended to:

- First-year graduate students (M.S. degree or Ph.D. students without an M.S. degree)
- Enrolled M.S. degree students beyond their first year provided that they plan full-time, uninterrupted study toward a Ph.D. at: 1) a different academic institution, OR 2) in a different department
- Applicants with no more than M.S. degrees who are not currently enrolled AND who will not have been enrolled in graduate school for two years prior to resuming graduate studies
- First-year Ph.D. students with an M.S. degree if they 1) completed the M.S. degree within 2 years at a different academic institution, 2) completed the M.S. degree within 2 years in a different academic department, OR 3) prior to current enrollment, they had not been enrolled in graduate school for at least 2 years.

During the fellowship period, fellows are required to be enrolled as full-time graduate students at an accredited U.S. college or university and conduct research in areas of interest to the DOE. The summer should be spent conducting full-time research related to the completion of one's degree program, enrolled in classes or on a practicum assignment.

**Award (max amount):** \$45,000 stipend p/year, \$1,000 profess. development allowance (4 years max)

[ACS Bridge Travel & Professional Development Award](#) - To defray registration and travel costs for underrepresented students to attend the ACS Spring 2023 National Meeting and/or any career and professional development event of the recipient's choice. This award will cover the registration, travel, and lodging costs for applicants who would like to attend the ACS Spring 2023 National Meeting and/or fees of other online workshops, courses, and virtual events. Professional Development activities can range from technical writing courses to business management programs to scientific meetings to technical skill workshops. Students should apply for this award to refine existing skills while also learning new ones to supplement their educational and career aspirations. Must be a U.S. Citizen and a graduate student in the chemical sciences.

[Promotion of Doctoral Studies Program](#) - The purpose of the Foundation's post-professional Promotion of Doctoral Studies (PODS) scholarship program is to help ensure that the profession has a sustainable supply of highly qualified physical therapy researchers. They fund licensed physical therapists and physical therapy assistants who are academic research doctoral degree students and candidates who are preparing for and who have high potential to have successful physical therapy research careers. The phased nature of the PODS program ensures that there is Foundation funding available to qualified applicants throughout their doctoral program.

[AES Pre-doctoral Research Fellowships](#) - AES Predoctoral Research Fellowships support predoctoral students who are pursuing dissertation research with an epilepsy-relevant theme, and who are working under the guidance of a mentor with expertise in epilepsy research. Proposals are welcomed across the spectrum of basic, translational, and clinical research.

The fellowship award offers up to \$30,000 for stipend and travel support to the AES Annual Meeting for one year, as well as a one-year AES membership. The number of awards granted each year is contingent upon available funds.

[AHA Rapid Impact Research Award](#) - The American Heart Association continuously seeks innovative ideas to address the most pressing issues impacting cardiovascular and brain health. To that end, the Association is pleased to announce the Rapid Impact Research Award program, which will support early and mid-career investigators proposing innovative research aligned with at least one of these specific research areas: Sudden cardiac arrest/resuscitation science, Cardiovascular Kidney Metabolic Syndrome, stroke and/or vascular dementias.

**Award (max amount):** Up to \$100,000 over 2 years

[Chateaubriand Fellowship Program](#) - The Chateaubriand Fellowship is a grant offered by the Embassy of France in the United States. It supports outstanding Ph.D. students from American universities who wish to conduct research in France for a period ranging from 4 to 9 months. Chateaubriand fellows are selected through a merit-based competition, through a collaborative process involving expert evaluators in both countries. The program is divided into two subprograms: Science, technology, engineering, math, and health; and humanities and social sciences.

**Award (max amount):** Living stipend (up to 1,750 euros per month), travel credit, health insurance

**Application deadline: January 25, 2026, 11:59PM (EST).**

[Andrew W. Mellon Research Fellowship](#)- To promote the interpretation of Virginia history and access to its collections, the Andrew W. Mellon fellowship offers short-term research funding opportunities.

These fellowships provide funding to support one-to two-week research visits. Support is considered to research in the following general categories of study, but are not limited to: Political, constitutional, religious, military, and Black studies; Business history, economic history, and labor relations; Gender, women's, and LGBTQ+ studies; Social, cultural, and literature studies. Fellowships are conferred on the basis of the applicants' scholarly qualifications, the merits of their proposals, and the appropriateness of their topics, as demonstrated by citation to specific sources in our collections. Applicants whose research promises to result in significant publication, including the *Virginia Magazine of History & Biography*, will receive primary consideration.

**Award (max amount):** \$500 per week for commuting researchers, \$1,000 per week to those who live farther away and incur greater expenses.

[Oncology Nursing Foundation Doctoral Scholarship](#)- To provide scholarships to registered nurses who are interested in and committed to oncology nursing to continue their education by pursuing a research doctoral degree (PhD or DNSc) or clinical doctoral degree (DNP).

[Harry Frank Guggenheim Emerging Scholars Awards](#)- The Foundation welcomes proposals from any of the natural and social sciences or allied disciplines that promise to increase understanding of the causes, manifestations, and control of violence and aggression. Highest priority is given to research that addresses urgent, present-day problems of violence—what produces it, how it operates, and what prevents or reduces it.

The Foundation is interested in violence related to many subjects, including, but not limited to, the following: War, Crime, Terrorism, Family and intimate-partner relationships; Climate instability and natural resource competition; Racial, ethnic, and religious conflict; Political extremism and nationalism. The Foundation supports research that investigates the basic mechanisms in the production of violence, but primacy is given to proposals that make a compelling case for the relevance of potential findings for policies intended to reduce these ills. Likewise, historical research is considered to the extent that it is relevant to a current situation of violence. Examinations of the effects of violence are welcome insofar as a strong case is made that these outcomes serve, in turn, as causes of future violence.

[Scholarships \(SME Education Foundation\)](#)- The Society of Manufacturing Engineers (SME) scholarships offer students a powerful reason to choose a manufacturing focused education. With more than 60 distinct scholarship programs, the Foundation provides merit and need-based scholarships, issues renewing and one-time awards, and seeks applications from all eligible students, including but not limited to young women and underrepresented communities. The Foundation has awarded 18 million to

over 5,000 future industry leaders since 2005 and awards nearly a million dollars in scholarships each year.

[China and Inner Asia Council Small Grants](#) - The China and Inner Asia Council of the AAS (CIAC) is soliciting applications for awards of up to \$2,000. Dissertation-level graduate students and scholars with special interests in China, Taiwan, or Inner Asia are invited to submit proposals. CIAC Small Grant awards are made possible through funding provided by the Chiang Ching-kuo (CCK) Foundation and from AAS member donations.

Types of Grants: Short research trips; Short research trips for translators; Organization of conferences and seminars; Specialist or regional newsletters or websites.

Applicants must be current AAS members, but there are no citizenship requirements. Dissertation-level graduate students, junior and independent scholars (including language pedagogues and librarians), and adjunct faculty are especially encouraged to apply, but scholars of all levels are eligible. Applicants must not have received a CIAC Small Grant within the past three years. Only one application per individual will be accepted in any one grant application round.

[Dalmas A. Taylor Memorial Summer Minority Policy Fellowship](#)- This fellowship is funded by Society for the Psychological Study of Social Issues (SPSSI) and administered in conjunction with APA Advocacy and the APA Minority Fellowship Program. It provides an opportunity for a doctoral student who is an ethnic minority to work on public policy issues for an entire summer. The Taylor Fellowship program emphasizes participation in a range of policy activities and can include a number of projects. In addition to attending congressional hearings and briefings, and other federal policy-focused events (e.g., meetings with federal agencies and policy coalitions), the Taylor Fellow can: Craft a policy brief, Write a blog post for SPSSI's "Sound Science, Sound Policy" blog, which is published by PsychologyToday, Plan a policy-focused webinar for SPSSI members and the broader social justice-minded APA community, Write a newsletter column for SPSSI's member e-newsletter, *Forward*. As part of the fellowship, the Taylor Fellow will also: Participate in SPSSI's Summer Conference and Policy Workshop preconference in Philadelphia (June 20-23, 2024), Meet SPSSI leaders and leaders at the intersection of the psychology and policy world, Conduct background research and draft policy materials alongside APA Public Interest Government Relations staff, Participate in APA's Minority Fellowship Program Summer Psychology Institute (typically held in person in Washington, DC in late June or early July)

**Award (max amount):** \$3,000 (\$4,500 if in person)

[Graduate Research Grant Competition](#)- OAR invites research proposals for its annual Graduate Research Grant Program. Note that these grants are for independent research studies only. Through this

competition, OAR intends to promote research in the following areas: The analysis, evaluation, or comparison of assessment models, treatment models, or service systems, Applied aspects of early intervention and/or school-based education, behavioral, or communication intervention, Adult issues such as continuing education, employment, housing models and “later intervention”, Issues related to family support, social and community integration, and assessment and intervention with challenging behavior, The efficacy of alternative or augmentative communication systems for autistic individuals across the lifespan, Applied research that occurs in the *in vivo* context in which the outcome of intervention is expected to be used. OAR seeks to fund studies that will likely produce practical and clearly objective results that may aid parents, families, professionals, and autistic people to make more fully informed choices that will lead to healthier and happier lives.

[National Fellowship Program](#)- The Jefferson Scholars Foundation encourages applicants from a broad range of disciplines, including, but not limited to, history, political science, policy studies, law, political economy, communications and media, and sociology. Applicants will be judged on the quality of their scholarship and on their potential to shed new light upon contemporary developments in American politics, foreign policy, and America and the World.

Each Fellow is required to participate in two conferences, one in the fall and one in the spring. The conferences provide a forum for presenting research and findings to the scholarly community at the Jefferson Scholars Foundation and the University of Virginia. The spring conference in particular provides an opportunity to receive feedback from mentors who are also in attendance. Expenses for both conferences are paid for by the Jefferson Scholars Foundation. An applicant must be a Ph.D. candidate who is expecting to complete his or her dissertation by the conclusion of the Fellowship year. This is not a post-doctoral fellowship. Non-U.S. citizens are eligible to apply.

Once a host laboratory and Research Adviser are identified and the applicant has contacted the proposed Research Adviser, an application is submitted through the NRC Research Associateship Programs online application system. Reviews are conducted four times each year, and review results are available to applicants six to eight weeks following the application deadline. Prospective applicants should carefully read the details and eligibility of the program to which they are applying.

The Research Grant provides up to \$1,000 for support of ongoing research in behavioral aspects of population studies or human reproductive behavior. Applicants must: Be graduate students conducting dissertation research or early career researchers with not more than 10 years postgraduate experience, Demonstrate interest in human reproductive behavior or related population concerns. Open to applicants in all relevant disciplines who have a demonstrated psychological approach to their work, with preference given to psychologists.

[Bernadotte E. Schmitt Grant for Research in European, African, or Asian History](#)- The American Historical Association offers the Bernadotte E. Schmitt Grants to support research in the history of Europe, Africa, and Asia. The funds for this program come from the earnings of a bequest from Bernadotte E. Schmitt, president of the Association in 1960. These modest annual grants are intended to further research in progress and may be used for travel to a library or archive, for microfilms, photographs, or photocopying—a list of purposes that is meant to be merely illustrative, not exhaustive (other expenses, such as child care, can be included). Individual grants up to \$1,500 will be awarded. See the list of past recipients. Only members of the Association are eligible to apply for AHA research grants. Grants are awarded each June and may be used anytime in the subsequent 15 months for expenses related to furthering research in progress. Preference will be given to advanced doctoral students, non-tenured faculty, and unaffiliated scholars, and to those with specific research needs, such as the completion of a project or a discrete segment thereof.

[Substance Use/Substance Use Disorder Dissertation Research Award \(R36 – Clinical Trials Optional\)](#)- The goal of this FOA is to support doctoral candidates from a variety of academic disciplines for up to two years for the completion of the doctoral dissertation research project. [Short-Term Research Fellowship](#)- The Association of Public Health Laboratories (APHL) and the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) are seeking degreed applicants who are interested in starting or furthering an exciting new career in laboratory science while working collaboratively with industry leaders and developing professional networks.

Fellowship stipends are \$1,000 per week for a minimum of two and maximum of four weeks. Non-U.S. citizens are eligible to apply.

In addition, this RFA welcomes research broader in scope than the Lancet definition of "profound autism" to include research on severe and challenging behaviors including self-injury, aggression, and irritability, and research focused on children under age 8.

Recipients usually produce articles, monographs, books, digital materials, archaeological site reports, translations, editions, or other scholarly resources in the humanities.

Projects may be at any stage of development.

Must be a member of Kappa Delta Pi.

[APHL-CDC: Bioinformatics Fellowship Program](#)- The New York Public Library is pleased to offer Short-Term Research Fellowships to support scholars from outside the New York metropolitan area engaged in graduate-level, post-doctoral, and independent research. Individuals needing to conduct on-site research in the Library's special collections are welcome to apply. Preference is given to applications making a strong case for accessing special collections materials.

Fellowships support a wide spectrum of public health laboratory program areas, such as: bioinformatics, biosafety and biosecurity, emergency preparedness and response, environmental health, infectious disease, informatics, food safety, newborn screening, and quality management. Each fellow will be trained in alignment with established public health laboratory core competencies and functions and will work on unique program-specific projects and other initiatives in host laboratories.
